**SPRING/SUMMER TIPS**

As the warm weather approaches, many folks are ready to start **new projects** for their homes. A new shed, fence, deck or pool, finished basement, electrical work, driveway expansion, retaining walls and grading of your yard all require permits through the General Services Department. We issue permits to protect you, your family and your guests. The fees are minimal and it assures your project is safe. You can contact us at 859-572-1210, stop by our offices at 130 N. Ft. Thomas Avenue between the hours of 8 and 4:30, or visit our website at [www.ftthomas.org](http://www.ftthomas.org) for all the information you need to complete your project.

You may also want to contact **Call Before U Dig** at 1-800-752-6007 before you add that new tree or flower bed. This is a free service that will mark your utilities so you don't accidentally disable yours or your neighbors' vital services.

**Summer** is a wonderful time of year, but it also presents us with a number of concerns as it relates to safety. Children are getting out of school and there is a lot of activity throughout the City. We want your family to be safe so here are a couple of tips to enjoy the summer:

**Stay away from construction sites** - These are very appealing to children and adults alike, but there are a lot of dangers. New homes under construction/rehab such as the homes at Alexander Circle in Tower Park or the construction/rehab of a larger buildings such as Johnson Elementary, present many dangers. The roof system, walls or other parts of a project, might not be completely braced yet and be a hazard by a small wind or slight pressure. Construction equipment may be maneuvering on the site and operators may not see or anticipate people on a site. When stationary after hours, they can be a danger if accidentally activated. Sites are not typically graded and it's easy to make a misstep on rough dirt or rock, twisting ankles and falling in construction debris. Various construction materials such as nails or rebar can be hidden in the dirt and go right through a shoe or cut someone's leg if not noticed.

**HOMESTEAD/DISABILITY EXEMPTIONS**

To qualify for the Homestead exemption a homeowner must be or going to be 65 anytime during 2019. You must have resided at the property location on or before January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 and be listed as owner, trustee or retain life estate. Please visit the Campbell County Property Valuation Administration office located on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Campbell County Fiscal Court building at 10<sup>th</sup> & Monmouth Streets in Newport. To apply, bring your driver's license or state ID that has your home address on it. You do not have to wait until your birth date to apply, you can go any time during the year you turn 65.

For the Disability exemption you must be 100% disabled thru Social Security, have resided at the property location on or before January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 and be listed as owner, trustee or retain life estate.

Please visit the Campbell County Property Valuation Administration and bring your Award letter or BPQY. You must also have your driver's license or state ID that has your home address on it. There is no age restriction on the DEX exemption.

The Homestead/Disability exemption has gone up for the 2019-2020 tax years. The new amount is \$39,300 which means that if your home is assessed for \$200,000 you would pay taxes on \$160,700. A person can only receive the Homestead or Disability Exemption on their primary residence.
