May 2019 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS

SRO Zac Rohlfer hosted two groups of children from Bluebird Christian Preschool for a Police Department and Cruiser tour. The students were also introduced to Detective Micheal Rowland and his partner, K9 Rexo.

The Fort Thomas Police Department, along with other Campbell County Police Departments, once again accompanied the members of the Rolling Thunder Annual Memorial Parade. Raising awareness of the service members is the entire reason for Rolling Thunder's existence and for the Demonstration Ride. Its intent is to publicize the issue of those soldiers, sailors, airmen and Marines considered missing in action and to make Americans aware of those who were prisoners of war during all past conflicts. Currently, Rolling Thunder lists more than 85,000 MIA's dating back to World War I. The group has chapters throughout the country, with most either being bikers or veterans. Neither, however, is a prerequisite for membership. The City of Fort Thomas is honored to be a part of this event and extends our sincere appreciation to all veterans and their families for their service and support.

SRO Zac Rohlfer spoke to three group of students that attend a temporary pre-school provided by the high school Family and Consumer Science class every year. He talked about policing and also let them explore the police cruiser.

TRAINING:

Officer Adam Peak and Joe Paolucci attended *Critical Officer Skills Class*. This course focused on critical officer skills in which officers must possess and maintain proficiency in order to do their jobs safely and effectively. This course is designed to enhance the skills and knowledge of law enforcement officers in vehicle operations, tactical medical skills, officer rescue, and counter-ambush situations with the use of non-lethal training weapons and ammunition. It incorporates instruction on vehicle close quarter combat (CQB), which includes transitioning into live-fire drills. This training is designed to heighten the critical skills of all patrol officers.

- Operations Chapter 23 Radio Communications
- Officers reviewed several 2018 case law updates from the Supreme Court involving use of force, search and seizure, pursuit, etc.
- Officers viewed an OSHA training tutorial video on Identifying Confined Spaces. This training is required for accreditation.

MISCELLANEOUS:

Sergeant Adam Noe received a thank you letter from a young resident. He wrote "I am very thankful for you getting my bike back. I paid a lot for that bike and I really like it so it really means a lot to me. Thank you for going out of your way and bringing my bike back."

ENFORCEMENT:

In May, officers wrote 48 speeding charges, 25 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 94 traffic charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 120 written warnings and totaled 20 court appearances. There were 18 total drug related charges placed against 12 adults and one juvenile. Three of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to three of the charges.
