July 2016 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:



Summer brought us another Independence Day Celebration at Tower Park and the Fourth of July Race and Parade. All of the events were very well attended and enjoyed by all especially the awesome fireworks at the end of the event. City departments work very hard before, during, and after this event to ensure the safety and success for this celebration. Approximately 7,000 people visited Tower Park throughout the day.

This year's theme for the Parade was Honoring First Responders. Lieutenant Casey Kilgore was this year's Grand Marshall. Pictured with Casey is his wife Lauren and their children James, Kate, and Erin.

TRAINING:

Officer Michael Dietz attended Current Issues for Patrol Officers. This course is designed to enhance an officer's knowledge concerning current issues and trends impacting law enforcement. The learning outcomes for this course will be for the student to identify current issues, problems, and possible solutions dealing with police and community relations, police ethics, threat groups, street crimes, use of force updates, veteran's issues, law enforcement technology and conflict resolution.

Lieutenant Casey Kilgore and Officer Adam Peak attended Digital Photography. This course is designed for patrol officers and investigators who need advanced training in police photography. The learning outcomes for this course will be for the student to demonstrate how to obtain proper digital exposures using metering, white balance, low-light and flash photography techniques.

RECOGNITION:

On July 27, 2016 Officer Nick Hoffman received the 2016 Governor's Occupant Protection Enforcement Award at an awards banquet held at the Hyatt Regency in Lexington KY. During the time frame of June 11, 2015 through June 10, 2016, the Fort Thomas Police Department had a total of 459 seat belt/child restraint charges. Officer Hoffman was responsible for 153 of those charges. This is Nick's second consecutive year to receive this award. Congratulations Nick on a job well done and for your efforts to save lives!

MISCELLANEOUS:

The Police Department is very appreciative of the numerous acts of support, kindness and encouragement that we have received from our community after the terrible tragedies in Dallas and Baton Rouge. We truly appreciate the community in which we serve.

ENFORCEMENT:

In July officers wrote 10 speeding charges, 6 DUI charges, 32 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 86 traffic charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 102 written warnings and totaled 39 court appearances. There were 26 drug related charges placed against 16 adults and one drug charge placed against a juvenile. Three of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to 13 of the charges.




Fort Thomas Police Investigations July 2016 Monthly Report




Fort Thomas Detectives have received 13 new cases in July. Over the past several months we have seen an increase in car break-ins throughout the city. These incidents are not only confined to Fort Thomas, but have included several surrounding cities including, but not limited to Southgate, Newport and Bellevue. We are continually working with these agencies to identify the subjects responsible for these incidents.



Investigation Updates

- Detectives are wrapping up the investigation to the I-275 crash in February where one occupant was killed. This investigation will result in charges being placed on the two adult survivors.
- Due to the number of car break-ins and the various locations these crimes are taking place; we are asking the public to be aware of your surrounding and report any suspicious activity. The subjects are targeting unlocked cars and can hit a large amount of vehicles in a very short amount of time on any given street. **PLEASE LOCK YOUR DOORS!!!!** This is the easiest way to prevent you from becoming a victim!
