November 2016 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:

Sergeant William Hunt to four kindergarten classes at Johnson Elementary. They are currently learning about community helpers.

Sergeant William Hunt and Officer Zac Rohlfer spoke to the 4th and 5th graders at Moyer Elementary for their health and safety fair, providing presentations and lectures.

Officer Nathan Day met with 6 members of the Bear Cub Scout Troop 390, Den 3. He spoke with them about the duties of a police officer, provided them with general safety tips, helped them roll their own finger prints, and taught them how to lift latent finger prints. He also provided police pencils and stick on badges.

Approximately ninety 3rd graders from Johnson Elementary visited the City Building to learn about City Government. A City representative from each department explained the services they provide to the residents and businesses of Fort Thomas and also conducted a question and answer period. The students enjoyed the visit and interacted with each speaker. Along with his presentation Officer Zac Rohlfer distributed stick on badges and police pencils.

TRAINING:

Chief Mike Daly and Lieutenant Rich Whitford attended Police Executive Command Course. This course is designed for Kentucky Police Chiefs, Sheriffs, Directors and their executive staff. The curriculum, which is updated annually, addresses the most current leadership, administrative and legal issues confronting law enforcement executives. This course meets the statutory requirements regarding Asset Forfeiture training. This course will enable the student to identify the most current leadership, administrative and legal issues confronting law enforcement executives.

Officer Tom Carr attended Legal Issues: 2016. This course provides in-class instruction of legal topics by providing a review of recent court decisions and legislative changes to the laws that are applicable to the Kentucky Revised Statutes. This course meets the statutory requirements regarding Asset Forfeiture training. In this course, the student will be able to discuss current developments on the constitutional topics of laws of arrest, search and seizure, pretrial identification procedures, interviews and interrogations and revisions to Kentucky Revised Statutes Chapter 218A - the Commonwealth's drug enforcement statutes.

Sergeant Brent Moening attended Values Based Leadership. This is an advanced leadership course designed for graduates of the Academy of Police Supervision and other mid-level executives (Sergeant/Lieutenant/Captain). The course explores individual and organizational values and how value-conflict affects attitudes and morale. The course will emphasize the significance of aligning organizational and personal virtues, innovative communications, effective listening skills, and ethical decision making. Students are required to participate in reading and writing assignments and complete leadership practical exercises. The learning outcomes for this course will be that the student will have a greater understanding of occupational, organizational, individual values and how to align those values to further the student's agency/organizational mission. The student will communicate these values through the introduction and exposure of additional leadership styles. This course is designed for graduates of the Academy of Police Supervision (APS) and other mid-level executives. All attendees must be graduates of the Academy of Police Supervision (APS).

Officer Michael Dietz attended Rooster Combatives Enhanced Carbine Course. This course exposed the attendee to advanced applications beyond "traditional static" training and enhanced the attendee's deployment capabilities through a myriad of shooting exercises at distance, mid-range, and up close and personal. The course started with an initial overview of individual skills (i.e. stance, mount, weapon zero, and reloads) and then quickly evolved into advanced carbine shooting techniques and tactics (i.e. bilateral shooting, enhanced speed shooting, vertical displacements, and more). Also covered was vehicle deployments from around, within, and from a moving vehicle.

RECOGNITION:

The department received a thank you note from residents on Madonna Place. They wrote to say thank you for watching their home when they traveled out of town and for keeping the City safe.

The 3rd grade students from Johnson Elementary wrote thank you letters to the Officers for talking to them when they visited the City Building for their annual City Government tour.

ENFORCEMENT:

In November, officers wrote 13 speeding charges, 1 DUI charge, 25 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 77 traffic charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 60 written warnings and totaled 48 court appearances. There were 5 drug related charges placed against 3 adults. None of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to 4 of the charges.

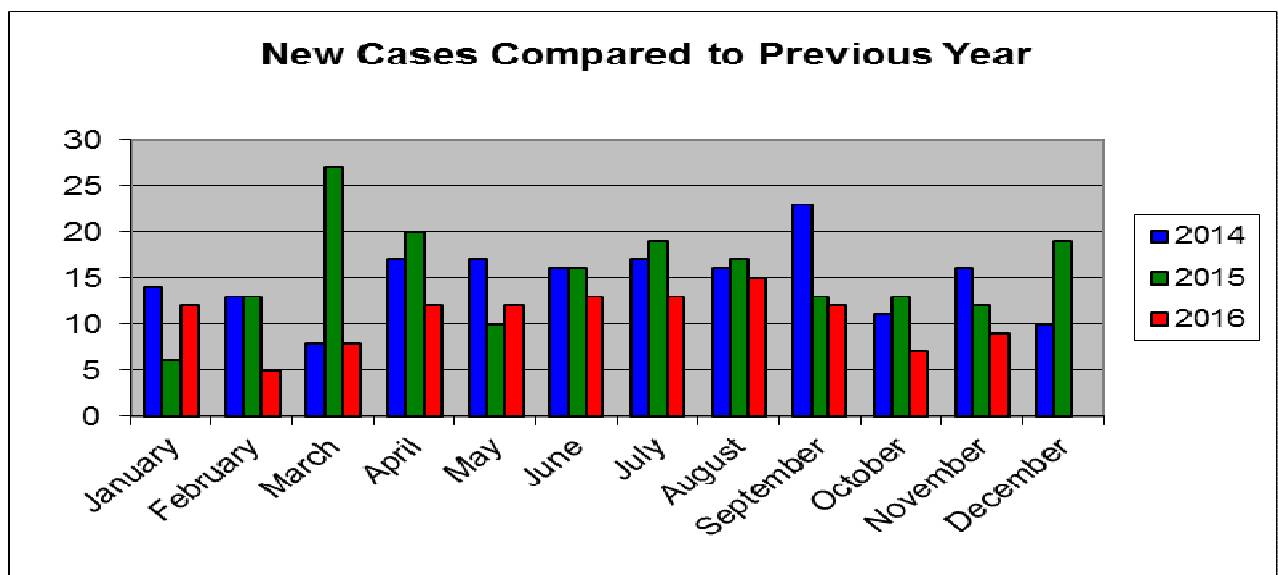

Investigation Updates

- On November 14th, 2016 investigators from the Fort Thomas Police Department assisted the Dayton Police Department in looking for a subject who escaped their custody while being treated at St. Elizabeth Fort Thomas. Multiple officers and agencies worked to locate the subject, but were unable to do so.

With further investigation it was found the subject was likely headed south and was ultimately located and arrested by the Kentucky State Police after being made aware of the subjects' movements.

The subject is currently incarcerated and is also facing charges from Fort Thomas Police.
