## ***September 2016 Monthly Report Summary***

### **COMMUNITY EVENTS:**

Approximately 10,000 people visited Tower Park throughout the day for the Thirteenth Annual Merchants and Music Festival. Congratulations to Debbie Buckley, Chairperson Linda Sloan, all the members of the Merchants and Music committee and the sponsors for their dedication and hard work to make this amazing event enjoyable for everyone.

Ft Thomas Detective Adam Noe along with 5 other investigators from Northern KY participated in the Annual Children's Advocacy Center 5K run to help raise money to help offset expenses of operating the center. The Children's Advocacy Center assists Detectives from the Northern Kentucky area with investigations of different types of child abuse. After a child discloses abuse, the family deals with many stressful issues. Staff will provide support, information, education, crisis counseling and assistance in completing Crime Victims Compensation applications.

### **TRAINING:**

Officer Zac Rohlfer attended the annual CIT Conference. The conference discusses the updates on current CIT practices in the state and an update on what has been going on around the state. There were also speakers and awards for CIT officers of the year.

Lieutenant Casey Kilgore attended Basic Search and Rescue training presented by Kentucky Emergency Management Department of Military Affairs.

### **RECOGNITION:**

Lieutenant Rich Whitford received a thank you note from St. Thomas School for providing a ride to school in a cruiser as a Silent Auction gift.

### **ENFORCEMENT:**

In September, officers wrote 14 speeding charges, 8 DUI charge, 34 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 156 traffic charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 70 written warnings and totaled 36 court appearances.

There were 19 drug related charges placed against 13 adults and 3 drug charges placed against 2 juveniles. Three of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to 12 of the charges.

## **Fort Thomas Police Investigations September 2016 Monthly Report**



*(Information as of October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2016)*

During the month of September our Detectives continued to work numerous theft cases including more thefts from vehicles. Detectives also responded to another threat at the high school, which resulted in a juvenile being charged for those threats. Along with these investigations our Detectives began investigating 12 new cases through the month.

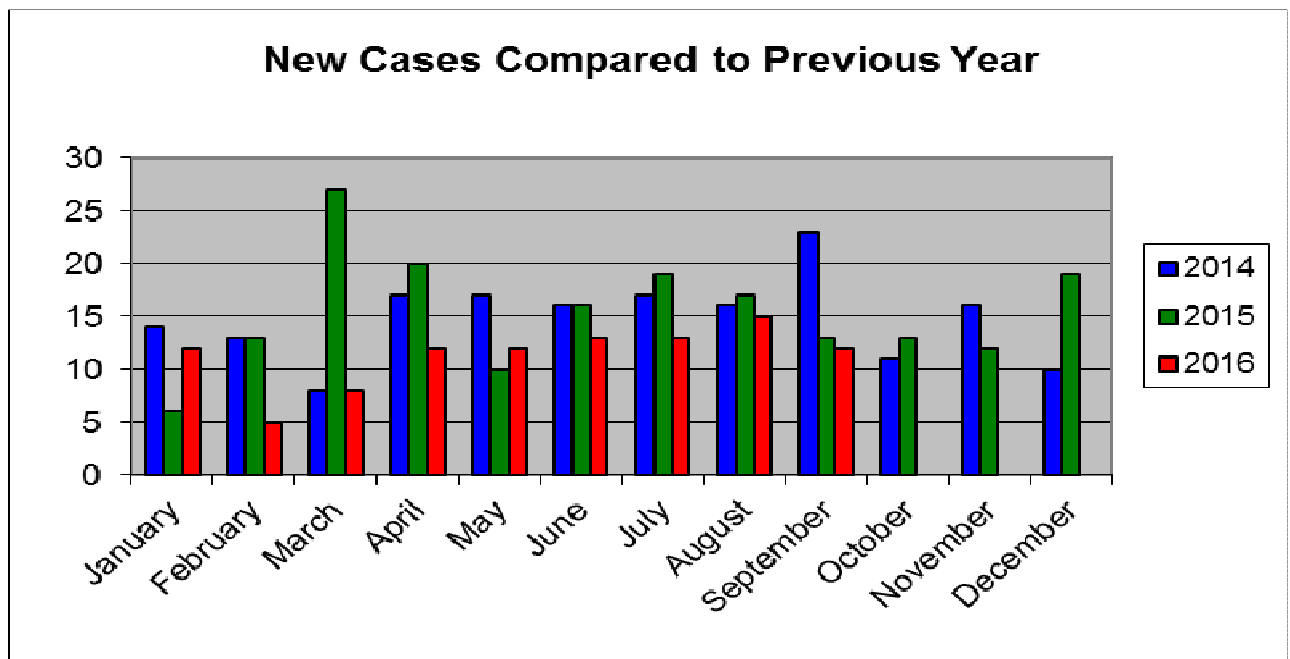

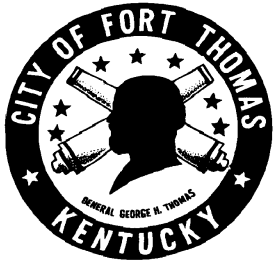

### Investigation Updates

- Detectives have been working cases of car break-ins over the span of a couple days in early September. These thefts were quick and specific to purses being observed in the vehicle. The suspects are pieces of a large scale East Coast operation also known as the “Felony Lane Gang”. Detectives are working with several other agencies across the Midwest to hopefully identify these suspects.
- Detectives were called to Highlands High School for a subject making threats while in school. The subject was identified and charged for the threats made while in school.
- On September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2016 a trial was held in the case against Nicholas Reckley. In August of 2015 Reckley was charged with the incidents relating to a jogger being physically assaulted by Reckley. After an intense 3 day trial, Reckley was found guilty and is currently awaiting his sentencing hearing.
