## *February 2020 Monthly Report Summary*

### COMMUNITY EVENTS:

Fort Thomas Police in partnership with the Fort Thomas branch of the Campbell County Library hosted another Family Protection Course. The course features a 12-hour curriculum for women and children that focuses on threat awareness, unarmed and armed defense, and Stop the Bleed training. Great job to all the ladies who participated and to local resident Jill Hamblen for assisting as instructor.

### TRAINING:

Sergeants Adam Noe, Nathan Day, Derek Faught, and Officers Zac Rohfler, William Martin, and Detectives Nick Hoffman and Wayne Duple attended "***Stewards of Children***". This class is an evidence-informed, award-winning two-hour training that teaches adults to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. Through interviews with child sexual abuse survivors, experts, and treatment providers, Stewards of Children teaches adults practical actions they can take to reduce instances of child sexual abuse in their organizations and families.

Officer Sean Donelan attended ***Officer-In-Charge Training***. This two-day advanced training course is designed specifically for law enforcement professionals serving in the capacity of Officer-in-Charge, and not targeted to or limited to police supervisors.

Officer Carl Harris attended ***Leadership Is a Behavior***. This course is designed to be an introduction to basic leadership principles for the patrol officer. It is extremely beneficial for those who are assigned leadership responsibility in their agency as Police Training or Field Training officers. Attendees can expect assignments that will require them to perform activities during hours outside the normal classroom times. The learning outcomes for this course are identifying the characteristics and principles of a good leader, learning how values can create conflict and how to effectively resolve those conflicts. The student will use written scenarios to apply leadership principles learned in class. The student will read an assigned book and answer questions about the characteristics of good leadership based on the reading assignment. APS graduates and those with the rank of Supervisor and above will not be permitted to enroll in this class. Each student is REQUIRED to complete the assignment before class in order to continue training.

Sergeant Adam Noe attended ***Introduction to Incident Command System***. Course Objectives included:

- Explain the principles and basic structure of the Incident Command System (ICS).
- Describe the NIMS management characteristics that are the foundation of the ICS.
- Describe the ICS functional areas and the roles of the Incident Commander and Command Staff.
- Describe the General Staff roles within ICS.
- Identify how NIMS management characteristics apply to ICS for a variety of roles and discipline areas.

Officers completed the following rollcall training: Officers read an article from Caliber Press outlining a court case on ***Handcuffing an Injured Suspect***. The article reviewed the factors established with *Graham v. Connor* and discussed the following points:

- “The mere act of handcuffing a subject can be unreasonable if done with excessive force.”
- “Officers must consider [pre-existing injuries] in determining whether it is appropriate to handcuff a suspect.”
- A bystanding officer “can be held liable” for a civil rights violation if he or she “had reason to know that a fellow officer was using excessive force and had a realistic opportunity to prevent” it.
- Even if an officer violates a subject’s constitutional rights, he “may still be entitled to summary judgment...if those rights were not ‘clearly established.’”

### **ENFORCEMENT:**

In February officers wrote 16 speeding charges, 24 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 92 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 96 written warnings and totaled 34 court appearances. There were 24 drug related charges placed against 12 adults and one juvenile. Two of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to 25 of the charges.

- ◆ The Ring app and Neighbors by Ring are finally up and running. The department issued a press release on how to utilize this great tool. We still urge residents to call 911 or the non-emergency (859).292.3622) line to report suspicious behavior. The Ring app is not monitored 24/7.
- ◆ It's beginning to be that time of year again when car "break-ins" (or people leaving their vehicle unlocked) are picking up in the area. Gettysburg Square was the hot spot at the end of February. We want to remind residents to lock their vehicles at all times and don't have anything of value in plain view. We also want residents and visitors to be aware of thefts at our parks throughout the city. These seems to pickup as the weather gets warmer and there are several cars in the area. The thieves will find a moment when no one is watching, break the car window and take whatever is sitting out in the open.
