January 2020 Monthly Report Summary

TRAINING:

Officer Zac Rohlfers attended ***SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER TRAINING 1***. This course is designed to meet the training needs of officers who are currently or will be assigned as a school resource officer. The learning outcomes for this course are for the officer to: Identify the foundations of school based law enforcement; the school resource officer as a teacher and mentor; youth mental health awareness; students with special needs; social media and cyber security; firearms refresher and defensive tactics. This course will count as week one of the three weeks required for school resource officers.

Officer William Martin began his basic academy class on August 5th at the Department of Criminal Justice Training. The academy consists of 20 weeks (800 hours) of a highly-structured curriculum. Officers come from various agencies throughout the state of Kentucky to obtain their certification. Will served as Class Leader of Class #507 and graduated on January 23, 2020. As Class Leader, he was asked to address the class at graduation. He has since returned to Fort Thomas to begin his Field Training with Officer Dietz and various other Field Training Officers. We would like to wish Will the best of luck in his Field Training and we look forward to seeing him become a solo officer! He has been assigned badge number 4455. Sergeants Adam Noe, Nathan Day, Derek Faught and Lieutenant William Hunt attended ***WORKING WITH THE MEDIA: A SHORT COURSE FOR EMERGENCY RESPONDERS***. Adapted from FEMA's curriculum, this 7-hour course provided rural first responders with skills needed to communicate with the public through the media. Roles of the media and rural first responder/public information officer were examined. Participants learned how to give print/electronic media interviews, write news releases, provide information at the scene, and how they fit into the joint information system.

Officers completed the following rollcall trainings:

- **Taser recertification training** which consisted of an updated PowerPoint presentation, verbal quiz, and the supervised firing of two Taser cartridges.
- **Legal update training** on use of force by reviewing several case law updates from the Sixth Circuit from the 4th quarter of 2018 and 1st & 2nd quarters of 2019. Updates were taken from the DOCJT Legal section website.
- **Weapons Inspection.** Fort Thomas PD range instructors inspected all pistols and rifles in use by officers for cleanliness, proper working order, ammunition count, and light and sight operation.

MISCELLANEOUS

Officer Adam Brown received a thank you note from a resident thanking him for helping them with a parking issue on their street. He states he and his wife appreciate what all officers do to make Fort Thomas a safe place to live. They have lived all over America and feel Fort Thomas is the nicest and safest.



To celebrate Catholic School Week students at St. Thomas raise money to order pizzas for local community partners in celebration of their contributions to Fort Thomas. They decided to once again recognize first responders for their service to the City. Students and teachers delivered the pizzas and personally thanked each organization. Thank you to everyone involved.

ENFORCEMENT:

In January officers wrote 25 speeding charges, 65 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 240 traffic charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 189 written warnings and totaled 25 court appearances. There were 55 drug related charges placed against 36 adults. Two of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to all of the charges.
