March 2020 Monthly Report Summary

TRAINING:

With March comes the PD handgun qualification. Officers participated in five different drills. Four of the drills worked on skills with our duty guns and one drill was designed for officers to practice with their off duty gun and off duty carry set-up. Our officers shot extremely well and the department as a whole is shooting at a highly skilled level. Much was also learned about real world issues that can be encountered during the off duty scenarios.

Officer Brandon Laffin attended ***Vehicle Operations Instructor***. This course is designed to enhance the officer's knowledge and skill level in both patrol and emergency vehicle operations. This course will include: vehicle dynamics, stopping, backing, turning, skid control, patrol driving, emergency response, pursuit techniques and night driving.

Detective Nick Hoffman became a certified ***Crime Scene Processing Officer*** when he completed a Career Development Program through Kentucky Law Enforcement Council.

Sergeant Adam Noe attended ***FEMA Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response***. This training reviews the context for ICS within initial response, and supports higher level ICS training. This course provides training on, and resources for, personnel who are likely to assume a supervisory position with ICS

MISCELLANEOUS:

The Police Department received a thank you note from a resident regarding our vacation check program. She posted the following message on Facebook. "I didn't realize just how outstanding the police services in Fort Thomas could be until this year. We recently installed a doorbell camera as part of our new security system, so every time someone approached the house, we received a video notification. Over the period of time we were gone, not only did the police officers drive past, but multiple times, the officer got out of his vehicle, checked the front door and then walked around the back of the house as well. I have never felt unsafe leaving town for a few days, but this level of service is way above and beyond. Thank you so much, FTPD!"

Detectives Nick Hoffman and Wayne Duple received a thank you note from a student at Highlands Middle School whose bike was stolen. The letter read thanks for taking the time out of your day to find my bike. I have learned a valuable lesson about my belongings and protecting my assets. I am sorry that I might have taken time away for more pressing matters. Thank you, Brody Cook.

ENFORCEMENT:

In March officers wrote nine speeding charges, 24 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 36 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 45 written warnings and totaled 15 court appearances. There were 11 drug related charges placed against seven adults. Traffic stops led to seven of the charges.

REMEMBER...

No government agency will ever ask you to send Google Play, Green-Dot gift cards or any other form of gift card type payment.

Never send large amounts of cash.

Never hesitate to hang up the phone, look up a number for the organization that contacted you and call back to verify what was said to you.

Lock your vehicle and remove valuables from your vehicle.

Monitor your credit through Experian, TransUnion, or Equifax.

If you believe your identity has been stolen, notify credit bureaus and file a complaint through the Kentucky Attorney General's Office, and the Federal Trade Commission.
