August 2020 Monthly Report Summary

TRAINING:

Officer Kalin Holland attended ***Search Warrants & Digital Evidence***. The course provided information on obtaining and executing search warrants in cases involving digital evidence, with a focus on the similarities and differences between these and other search warrants. This course covers establishing probable cause, particularity, scope, and nexus; the use of outside experts; and out-of-state warrants for remote evidence.

Officer Adam Peak and Sergeant Nathan Day attended ***Critical Property Room Accountability and How to Achieve It***. Training included the common denominators of accountability, the value of having a robust and defensible policy and procedures, addressing issues of failure to train (landmark Supreme Court Case), and strategies for improvement. This webinar is critical for all levels, from the officer submitting evidence to the evidence and property room personnel and every level of supervision in between and the agency administration.

Officer Kalin Holland attended ***First Responders and Digital Evidence***. This course provided basic information for first responders who may encounter digital evidence in the course of their duties. Topics included the definition of digital evidence, where it can be found, the importance of getting digital devices to a forensics expert, and the ways in which digital evidence can be compromised. This course also addresses the issue of when a warrant is required to seize and/or search digital devices.

Roll Call Training: Officers completed training for the new ***CIS MCS*** mobile client that is replacing Interact MobileCop and a ***Policy and Procedures*** quiz regarding chapter six in the Investigations Manual and chapter five in the Operations Manual. Officers participated in ***Use of Force*** training.

Detective Nick Hoffman attended ***Financial Investigations Triage***. This course provided an overview of the actions investigators can take at the outset of a financial crime investigation. Students learn to ask critical questions, gather documentation, and analyze information for leads. Topics include obtaining and working with financial records, red flags in financial cases, money laundering, investigative strategies for different types of financial crimes, and commingled funds.

Officer Kalin Holland completed ***Heartsaver First Aid CPR AED*** training. The American Heart Association provides the curriculum for this training.

RECOGNITION:

Sergeant Nathan Day and Detective Wayne Duple received a thank you note from a young girl that had her cell phone stolen. She wrote thank you so much for finding my phone; it means the world to me. I was careless and irresponsible. Thank you from the bottom of my heart.

ENFORCEMENT:

In August, officers wrote 30 speeding charges, 26 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 97 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 64 written warnings and totaled 21 court appearances. There were 21 drug related charges placed against 14 adults. One of the individuals is a Fort Thomas resident. Traffic stops led to 14 of the charges.
