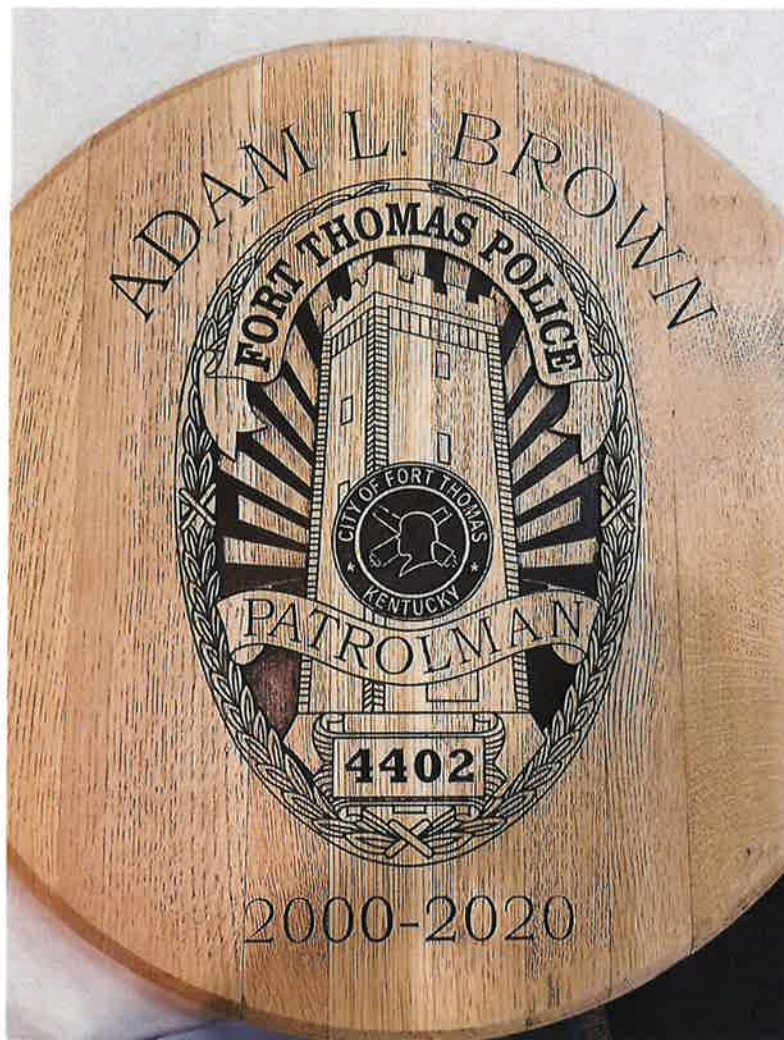

November 2020 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:

Officer Sean Donelan and Detective Nick Hoffman participated in the nationwide DEA Drug Take Back Day. The two provided a drive-thru service in front of the city building to gather old, outdated and unused medications. The medications are delivered to the DEA's Cincinnati pickup location to be incinerated. The program helps keep drugs off the streets, out of sewers, landfills and out of the hands of those for which the medication is not prescribed.

TRAINING:

Detective Nick Hoffman completed ***Police Mandatory Training - Online 2020***. This class meets the mandatory training requirements for officer certification. This course provided the student with information about domestic abuse committed by law enforcement officers. Information in this presentation will include how to respond when the law enforcement officer is the suspect or when the law enforcement officer is the victim.

Officers completed ***Low Light and Night Range Training***. With the darker days comes Fall Range Training that includes a mix of rifle and pistol work. This range training focuses on speed while maintaining accuracy. Officers are doing drills during day light and repeating them at night to see the difference in times and ability.

Officer Brandon Vance attended ***Ethical Policing in Contemporary Times***. This class teaches critical areas of law enforcement ethics and decision making. The course covers a legal review, transparency, ethics, social media, de-escalation, use of force, 42 U.S.C § 1983 civil suits, decision-making, and other current topics in today's environment.

Detective Nick Hoffman attended ***Vehicle Operations: Driving for a Safer Tomorrow***. This on-line course is designed to teach the critical areas of Law Enforcement driving. The topics covered included a legal review, pursuits, properly clearing intersections, electronic stability control, inclement weather, police sport utility vehicles and vehicle maintenance.



After 20 years of dedicated service to the residents of Fort Thomas, Officer Adam Brown retired from our department at the end of October 2020. Adam was a great asset to us, often leading our department in drug arrests, DUI arrests, and felony arrests. His years of experience and knowledge of police tactics made him an excellent resource to our younger officers. Adam was instrumental in elevating our firearms training, making several of our officers the top shooters in the region. Adam was a great friend and an excellent police officer, and he will be sorely missed.

ENFORCEMENT:

In November officers wrote 19 speeding charges, 23 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 40 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 20 written warnings and totaled 25 court appearances. There were 14 drug related charges placed against 10 adults. Traffic stops led to 10 of the charges.

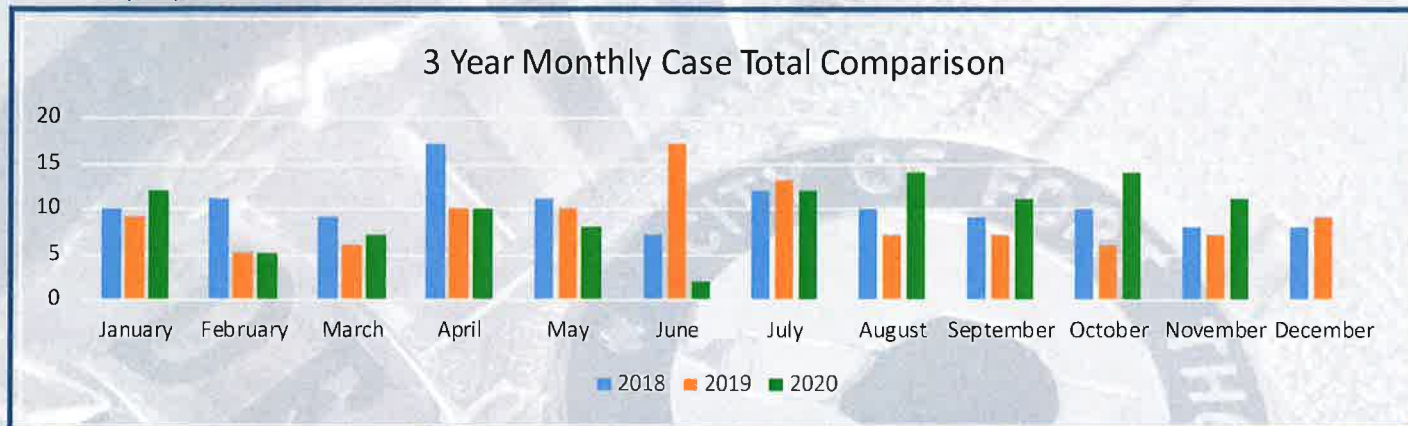
