January 2021 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:

The Fort Thomas Police Department donated six abandoned bicycles to the Brighton Center in Newport, who will in turn give them to local children in need. Bikes that are found and not claimed must be kept in the police department's possession for at least 90 days before they are eligible for forfeiture. The majority of the bikes donated this time have been in the department's possession for at least a year. This is the tenth year the Police Department has been able to donate bikes to Brighton Center.

TRAINING

SWAT team leaders Officer Michael Dietz and Lieutenant Chris Carpenter instructed new SWAT operators on close quarters tactics (CQT) that included room clearing with two and four-man elements, threat prioritization, weapons handling, and other skills related to clearing structures as part of the SWAT team. These same tactics are also inculcated to our patrol officers to make the city's officers some of the best trained in the state.

Officers completed the following Roll Calling Trainings:

- Garrity Rights and other associated issues dealing with investigatory interviews in the workplace.
- Practiced multiple shoot/no shoot scenarios in the parking lot in front of the water tower using air soft pistols.
- Officers viewed KY League of Cities Insurance Services Safety Driving Modules 1 & 2.

ENFORCEMENT:

In January officers wrote 5 speeding charges, 26 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 26 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 23 written warnings and totaled eight court appearances. There were eight drug related charges placed against five adults. None of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to six of the charges.

FTPD received a call for a bomb threat at Carmel Manor. It was quickly determined that the threat was not credible, but precautions were taken in the event that it was real. Detectives investigated the threat, and quickly identified, interviewed, and charged two individuals for the threat. One of those individuals claimed responsibility for an unrelated case from June 2020 involving harassing phone calls to Carmel Manor as well.

Detectives received a report of a theft of packages off of an Amazon truck. Subsequent investigation involved executing a search warrant, recovering most of the stolen property and identifying two suspects. Investigation is still ongoing and charges are pending.
