***March 2021 Monthly Report Summary***

**COMMUNITY EVENTS:**

School Resource Officer Zac Rohlfer spoke to all senior government classes. They discussed modern day policing and police service as it relates to the government and citizens. The students were also able to submit anonymous questions about policing.

**TRAINING**

Sergeant Nathan Day attended **Criminal Justice Executive Development Session 1**. This program is structured for small to medium size law enforcement agency administrators and managers. The purpose is to provide the students with contemporary theories, management techniques, and leadership skills enabling them to perform more effectively and efficiently in their positions as community leaders. The course prepares the leaders of today for the challenges they will face in the future. The law enforcement functional areas that will be addressed are problem identification, analysis and solving; personnel administration; operations and fiscal management; policies and procedures; legal concerns; and organizational behavior/culture. Topics emphasized throughout the course include leadership, ethics, executive writing, and public speaking. The program requires a high level of motivation, completion of projects/assignments, and the commitment to complete the entire course. The CJED course is a challenging and rewarding educational experience. The CJED Leadership Association Officers review all applications and recommends the selection of attendees to the Department of Criminal Justice Training. The learning outcomes for this course are for students to develop an increased level of confidence in the performance of executive duties to include public speaking, budgeting, executive writing, and organizational management.

Chief Casey Kilgore and Detective Micheal Rowland attended **Regional Organized Crime Information Center Conference**. Topics included:

- The Anatomy of Modern Direct Action Protests
- Hidden Plain Sight: Alternative Right Radically Motivated Extremist
- ANTIFA: Move Like Water
- Intelligence Gathering During Civil Unrest
- Surviving Violent Encounters and Threats
- Narcotics Officers and Law Enforcement Departments Confronting the Rise of Social Unrest
- Anti-Government Militias
- Picking Up the Pieces: Bombing and Explosives

Officers completed **CPR, AED, and First Aid Combination Training**. This class will assist officers seeking a comprehensive training class. The program helps develop the knowledge, skills, and confidence to respond to a medical emergency.

Sergeant Derek Faught attended **Property and Evidence Room Management**. This class is designed to enhance the skills and knowledge to properly operate and manage a Property and Evidence Room according to state and federal law and regulations. The learning outcomes for this course are for the student to identify safe storage, handling, packaging, and submission for testing for biohazards, synthetic opioids, sexual assault kits and other various types of evidence as mandated in Kentucky Revised Statutes and other requirements.

Detective Nick Hoffman completed **Breath Test Operator Recertification – Online**. This course covers recent legal information and is a refresher of operator techniques and procedures for the breath testing instruments used in the Commonwealth, Intoxilyzer 5000EN and the Intoxilyzer 8000.

Officers completed annual Taser re-certification training. All officers are provided with a copy of the Taser handheld CEW warnings, instructions, and information for law enforcement packet. The training included the review of the power point presentation and training bulletins. All officers had to demonstrate safe handling of the CEW, which included proper finger placement along with aiming and deployment at the preferred target area while loading and unloading. All officers had to deploy two live cartridges placing each probe within the preferred target areas. Officers also had to perform a proper warning ARC. During our department pistol range day, Officers did several live fire drills where they had to transition from taser to pistol.

### **ENFORCEMENT:**

In March officers wrote 16 speeding charges, 17 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 50 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 41 written warnings and totaled 12 court appearances. There were 20 drug related charges placed against 14 adults and 2 juveniles. Eight of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to 11 of the charges.
